Demographic Profile

In 2010, the population in the City of Branson, MO was 10,520.

The region has a civilian labor force of 5,398 with a participation rate of 58.6%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in the City of Branson, MO, 25.5% have a bachelors degree or higher which compares with 31.3% in the nation.

The median household income in the City of Branson, MO is \$40,303 and the median house value is \$167,800.



Employment Trends


As of 2016Q4, total employment for the City of Branson, MO was 18,952 (based on a four-quarter moving average). Over the year ending 2016Q4, employment declined 2.9% in the region.



Employment data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2016Q2 with preliminary estimates updated to 2016Q4.

Wage Trends

The average worker in the City of Branson, MO earned annual wages of \$29,592 as of 2016Q4. Average annual wages per worker increased 1.1% in the region during the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$52,285 in the nation as of 2016Q4.



Annual average wages per worker data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2016Q2 with preliminary estimates updated to 2016Q4.



Cost of Living Index

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 13.6% lower in City of Branson, MO than the U.S. average.


The Cost of Living Index is developed by Chmura Economics & Analytics and is updated quarterly.



Industry Snapshot

The largest sector in the City of Branson, MO is Accommodation and Food Services, employing 5,930 workers. The next-largest sectors in the region are Retail Trade (3,561 workers) and Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation (2,917). High location quotients (LQs) indicate sectors in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The sectors with the largest LQs in the region are Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation (LQ = 7.81), Accommodation and Food Services (3.51), and Real Estate and Rental and Leasing (1.86).

Sectors in the City of Branson, MO with the highest average wages per worker are Management of Companies and Enterprises (\$79,801), Utilities (\$47,401), and Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services (\$47,008). Regional sectors with the best job growth (or most moderate job losses) over the last 10 years are Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation (+828 jobs), Accommodation and Food Services (+788), and Retail Trade (+588).

Over the next 10 years, employment in the City of Branson, MO is projected to expand by 1,383 jobs. The fastest growing sector in the region is expected to be Health Care and Social Assistance with a +1.8% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Accommodation and Food Services (+468 jobs), Health Care and Social Assistance (+317), and Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation (+280).

Occupation Snapshot

The largest major occupation group in the City of Branson, MO is Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations, employing 4,187 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Sales and Related Occupations (3,396 workers) and Office and Administrative Support Occupations (2,674). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (LQ = 2.56), Building and Grounds Cleaning and Maintenance Occupations (2.11), and Arts, Design, Entertainment, Sports, and Media Occupations (2.01).

Occupation groups in the City of Branson, MO with the highest average wages per worker are Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations (\$71,500), Architecture and Engineering Occupations (\$67,600), and Legal Occupations (\$67,400). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 1.3% among Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations to 8.3% among Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations.

Over the next 10 years, the fastest growing occupation group in the City of Branson, MO is expected to be Healthcare Support Occupations with a +1.9% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (+308 jobs) and Sales and Related Occupations (+167). Over the same period, the highest replacement demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (1,737 jobs) and Sales and Related Occupations (1,183).


Occupation employment data are estimated via industry employment data and the estimated industry/occupation mix. Industry employment data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and currently updated through 2016Q2, imputed where necessary with preliminary estimates updated to 2016Q4. Wages by occupation are as of 2015 provided by the BLS and imputed where necessary. Forecast employment growth uses national projections from the Bureau of Labor Statistics adapted for regional growth patterns.

Industry Clusters

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in the City of Branson, MO with the highest relative concentration is Consumer Svc. with a location quotient of 3.26. This cluster employs 9,386 workers in the region with an average wage of \$22,335. Employment in the Consumer Svc. cluster is projected to expand in the region about 0.8% per year over the next ten years.



Location quotient and average wage data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, imputed where necessary, and updated through 2016Q2 with preliminary estimates updated to 2016Q4. Forecast employment growth uses national projections from the Bureau of Labor Statistics adapted for regional growth patterns.

Education Levels

Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in the City of Branson, MO is projected to grow 0.7% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 1.5% per year, those requiring a bachelors degree are forecast to grow 0.8% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to grow 1.2% per year.

FAQ

What is a location quotient?

A location quotient (LQ) is a measurement of concentration in comparison to the nation. An LQ of 1.00 indicates a region has the same concentration of an industry (or occupation) as the nation. An LQ of 2.00 would mean the region has twice the expected employment compared to the nation and an LQ of 0.50 would mean the region has half the expected employment in comparison to the nation.

What is replacement demand?

Replacement demand is the number of jobs required due to replacements retirements and turnover resulting from workers moving from one occupation into another. Note that replacement demand does not include all turnover it does not include when workers stay in the same occupation but switch employers. The replacement demand shown in this report may also be understated; thus, it can be taken to be a minimum measure of the number of workers who will need to be trained for the occupation due to replacements. The total projected demand for an occupation is the sum of the replacement demand and the growth demand (which is the increase or decrease of jobs in an occupation expected due to expansion or contraction of the overall number of jobs in that occupation).

What is a cluster?

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. If a regional cluster has a location quotient of 1.25 or greater, the region is considered to possess a *competitive advantage* in that cluster.

What is the difference between industry wages and occupation wages?

Industry wages and occupation wages are estimated via separate data sets, often the time periods being reported do not align, and wages are defined slightly differently in the two systems (for example, certain bonuses are included in the industry wages but not the occupation wages). It is therefore common that estimates of the average industry wages and average occupation wages in a region do not match exactly.

What is NAICS?

The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) is used to classify business establishments according to the type of economic activity. The NAICS Code comprises six levels, from the %all industry+level to the 6-digit level. The first two digits define the top level category, known as the %ector,+which is the level examined in this report.

What is SOC?

The Standard Occupational Classification system (SOC) is used to classify workers into occupational categories. All workers are classified into one of over 820 occupations according to their occupational definition. To facilitate classification, occupations are combined to form 23 major groups, 96 minor groups, and 449 occupation groups. Each occupation group includes detailed occupations requiring similar job duties, skills, education, or experience.
