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Demographic Profile

The population in the City of Forsyth, MO was 2,538 per American Community Survey data for 2013-2017.

The region has a civilian labor force of 936 with a participation rate of 43.7%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in the City of Forsyth, MO, 20.4% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 32.3% in the nation.

The median household income in the City of Forsyth, MO is \$36,201 and the median house value is \$113,900.



Employment Trends


As of 2019Q3, total employment for the City of Forsyth, MO was 1,765 (based on a four-quarter moving average). Over the year ending 2019Q3, employment increased 2.1% in the region.



Employment data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2019Q1 with preliminary estimates updated to 2019Q3.

Wage Trends

The average worker in the City of Forsyth, MO earned annual wages of \$31,765 as of 2019Q3. Average annual wages per worker increased 1.9% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$57,681 in the nation as of 2019Q3.



Annual average wages per worker data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2019Q1 with preliminary estimates updated to 2019Q3.



Cost of Living Index

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 15.6% lower in City of Forsyth, MO than the U.S. average.



Industry Snapshot

The largest sector in the City of Forsyth, MO is Accommodation and Food Services, employing 286 workers. The next-largest sectors in the region are Health Care and Social Assistance (263 workers) and Retail Trade (242). High location quotients (LQs) indicate sectors in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The sectors with the largest LQs in the region are Real Estate and Rental and Leasing (LQ = 3.14), Public Administration (2.76), and Accommodation and Food Services (1.80).



Total Workers for City of Forsyth, MO by Industry

Employment data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2019Q1 with preliminary estimates updated to 2019Q3.

Sectors in the City of Forsyth, MO with the highest average wages per worker are Management of Companies and Enterprises (\$70,396), Finance and Insurance (\$54,612), and Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation Services (\$43,339). Regional sectors with the best job growth (or most moderate job losses) over the last 10 years are Health Care and Social Assistance (+152 jobs), Real Estate and Rental and Leasing (+66), and Manufacturing (+62).

Over the next 10 years, employment in the City of Forsyth, MO is projected to expand by 111 jobs. The fastest growing sector in the region is expected to be Health Care and Social Assistance with a +2.0% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Health Care and Social Assistance (+58 jobs), Accommodation and Food Services (+31), and Public Administration (+8).

Occupation Snapshot

The largest major occupation group in the City of Forsyth, MO is Office and Administrative Support Occupations, employing 260 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Sales and Related Occupations (196 workers) and Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (181). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Protective Service Occupations (LQ = 2.14), Community and Social Service Occupations (2.04), and Healthcare Support Occupations (1.23).

Occupation groups in the City of Forsyth, MO with the highest average wages per worker are Computer and Mathematical Occupations (\$77,300), Legal Occupations (\$76,200), and Management Occupations (\$73,500). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 2.3% among Management Occupations to 11.8% among Arts, Design, Entertainment, Sports, and Media Occupations.

Over the next 10 years, the fastest growing occupation group in the City of Forsyth, MO is expected to be Personal Care and Service Occupations with a +2.1% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (+20 jobs) and Personal Care and Service Occupations (+18). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (319 jobs) and Office and Administrative Support Occupations (290).



Occupation employment data are estimated via industry employment data and the estimated industry/occupation mix. Industry employment data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and currently updated through 2019Q1, imputed where necessary with preliminary estimates updated to 2019Q3. Wages by occupation are as of 2018 provided by the BLS and imputed where necessary. Forecast employment growth uses national projections from the Bureau of Labor Statistics adapted for regional growth patterns.



Industry Clusters

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in the City of Forsyth, MO with the highest relative concentration is Public Admin. with a location quotient of 3.01. This cluster employs 228 workers in the region with an average wage of \$37,159. Employment in the Public Admin. cluster is projected to expand in the region about 0.3% per year over the next ten years.



Education Levels

Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in the City of Forsyth, MO is projected to grow 0.6% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 1.3% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to grow 0.7% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to grow 0.8% per year.

FAQ

What is a location quotient?

A location quotient (LQ) is a measurement of concentration in comparison to the nation. An LQ of 1.00 indicates a region has the same concentration of an industry (or occupation) as the nation. An LQ of 2.00 would mean the region has twice the expected employment compared to the nation and an LQ of 0.50 would mean the region has half the expected employment in comparison to the nation.

What is separation demand?

Separation demand is the number of jobs required due to separations—labor force exits (including retirements) and turnover resulting from workers moving from one occupation into another. Note that separation demand does not include all turnover—it does not include when workers stay in the same occupation but switch employers. The total projected demand for an occupation is the sum of the separation demand and the growth demand (which is the increase or decrease of jobs in an occupation expected due to expansion or contraction of the overall number of jobs in that occupation).

What is a cluster?

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. If a regional cluster has a location quotient of 1.25 or greater, the region is considered to possess a *competitive advantage* in that cluster.

What is the difference between industry wages and occupation wages?

Industry wages and occupation wages are estimated via separate data sets, often the time periods being reported do not align, and wages are defined slightly differently in the two systems (for example, certain bonuses are included in the industry wages but not the occupation wages). It is therefore common that estimates of the average industry wages and average occupation wages in a region do not match exactly.

What is NAICS?

The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) is used to classify business establishments according to the type of economic activity. The NAICS Code comprises six levels, from the "all industry" level to the 6-digit level. The first two digits define the top level category, known as the "sector," which is the level examined in this report.

What is SOC?

The Standard Occupational Classification system (SOC) is used to classify workers into occupational categories. All workers are classified into one of over 820 occupations according to their occupational definition. To facilitate classification, occupations are combined to form 23 major groups, 96 minor groups, and 449 occupation groups. Each occupation group includes detailed occupations requiring similar job duties, skills, education, or experience.



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
