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# Demographic Profile

The population in the Branson, MO μSA was 54,720 per American Community Survey data for 2014-2018.

The region has a civilian labor force of 26,131 with a participation rate of 58.7%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in the Branson, MO μSA, 19.5% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 32.9% in the nation.

The median household income in the Branson, MO μSA is \$41,487 and the median house value is \$128,200.

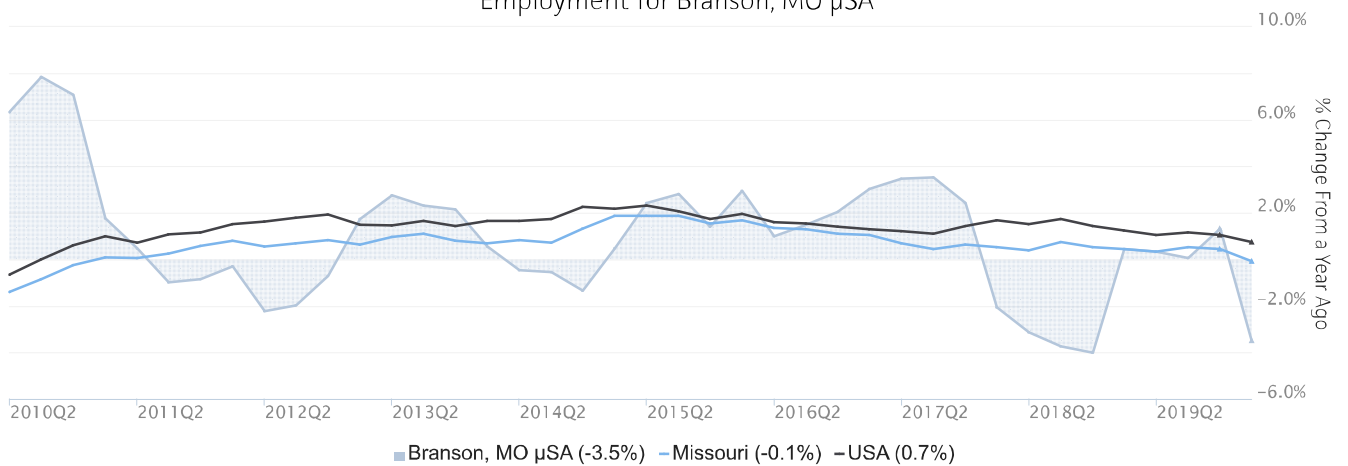

# Employment Trends

As of 2020Q1, total employment for the Branson, MO  $\mu$ SA was 31,298 (based on a four-quarter moving average). Over the year ending 2020Q1, employment declined 3.5% in the region.

Employment for Branson, MO  $\mu$ SA

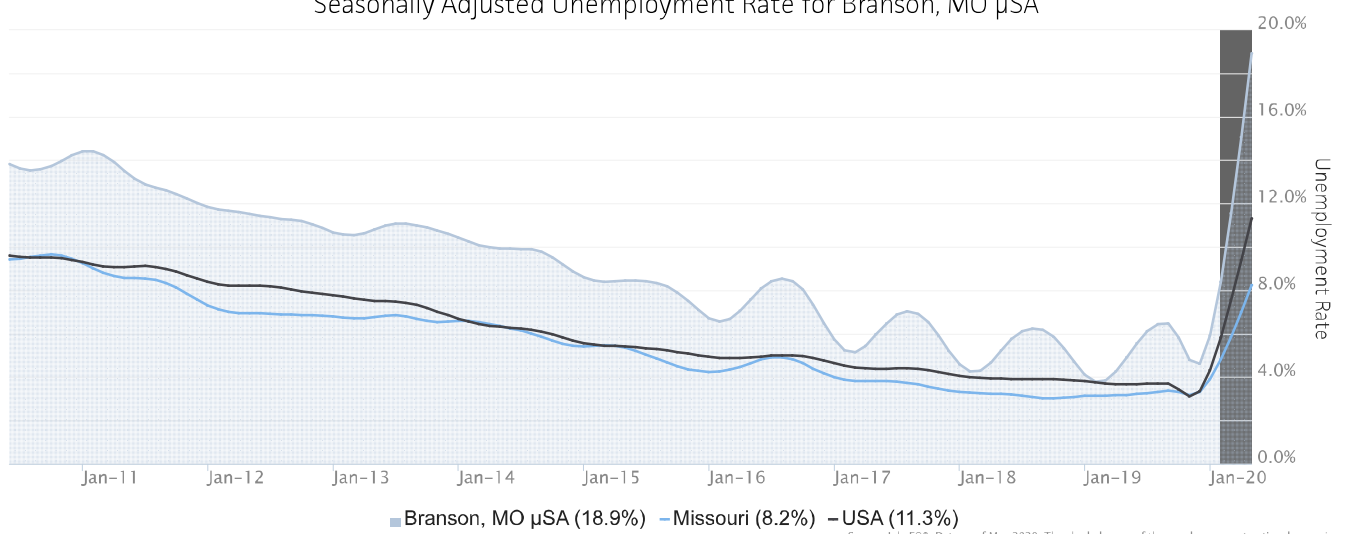

# Unemployment Rate

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for the Branson, MO  $\mu$ SA was 18.9% as of May 2020. The regional unemployment rate was higher than the national rate of 11.3%. One year earlier, in May 2019, the unemployment rate in the Branson, MO  $\mu$ SA was 4.9%.

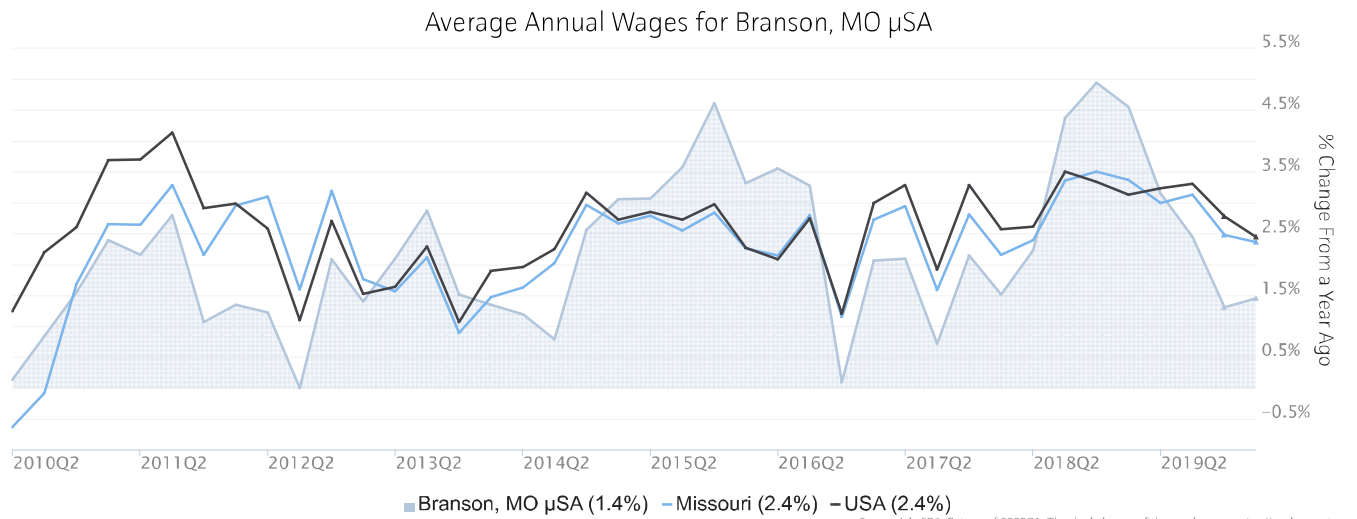
Seasonally Adjusted Unemployment Rate for Branson, MO  $\mu$ SA

# Wage Trends

The average worker in the Branson, MO μSA earned annual wages of \$31,804 as of 2020Q1. Average annual wages per worker increased 1.4% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$57,624 in the nation as of 2020Q1.

# Cost of Living Index

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 14.6% lower in Branson, MO  $\mu$ SA than the U.S. average.

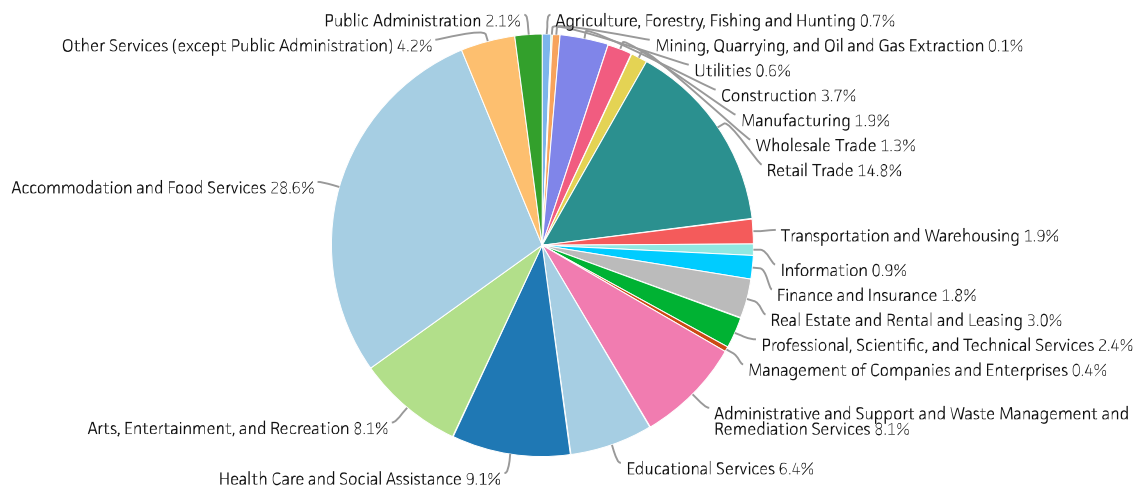

# Industry Snapshot

The largest sector in the Branson, MO  $\mu$ SA is Accommodation and Food Services, employing 8,961 workers. The next-largest sectors in the region are Retail Trade (4,635 workers) and Health Care and Social Assistance (2,850). High location quotients (LQs) indicate sectors in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The sectors with the largest LQs in the region are Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation (LQ = 4.05), Accommodation and Food Services (3.17), and Real Estate and Rental and Leasing (1.73).

Sectors in the Branson, MO  $\mu$ SA with the highest average wages per worker are Utilities (\$80,964), Management of Companies and Enterprises (\$71,147), and Finance and Insurance (\$54,571). Regional sectors with the best job growth (or most moderate job losses) over the last 10 years are Accommodation and Food Services (+1,422 jobs), Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation Services (+1,054), and Health Care and Social Assistance (+787).

Over the next 10 years, employment in the Branson, MO  $\mu$ SA is projected to expand by 895 jobs. The fastest growing sector in the region is expected to be Health Care and Social Assistance with a +1.4% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Accommodation and Food Services (+497 jobs), Health Care and Social Assistance (+416), and Construction (+111).

# Occupation Snapshot

The largest major occupation group in the Branson, MO μSA is Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations, employing 5,639 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Sales and Related Occupations (4,536 workers) and Office and Administrative Support Occupations (4,022). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Building and Grounds Cleaning and Maintenance Occupations (LQ = 2.18), Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (2.10), and Arts, Design, Entertainment, Sports, and Media Occupations (1.67).

Occupation groups in the Branson, MO μSA with the highest average wages per worker are Management Occupations (\$82,200), Computer and Mathematical Occupations (\$78,000), and Architecture and Engineering Occupations (\$76,700). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 1.8% among Legal Occupations to 11.2% among Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations.

Over the next 10 years, the fastest growing occupation group in the Branson, MO μSA is expected to be Healthcare Support Occupations with a +2.0% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (+522 jobs) and Healthcare Support Occupations (+183). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (10,124 jobs) and Sales and Related Occupations (6,390).

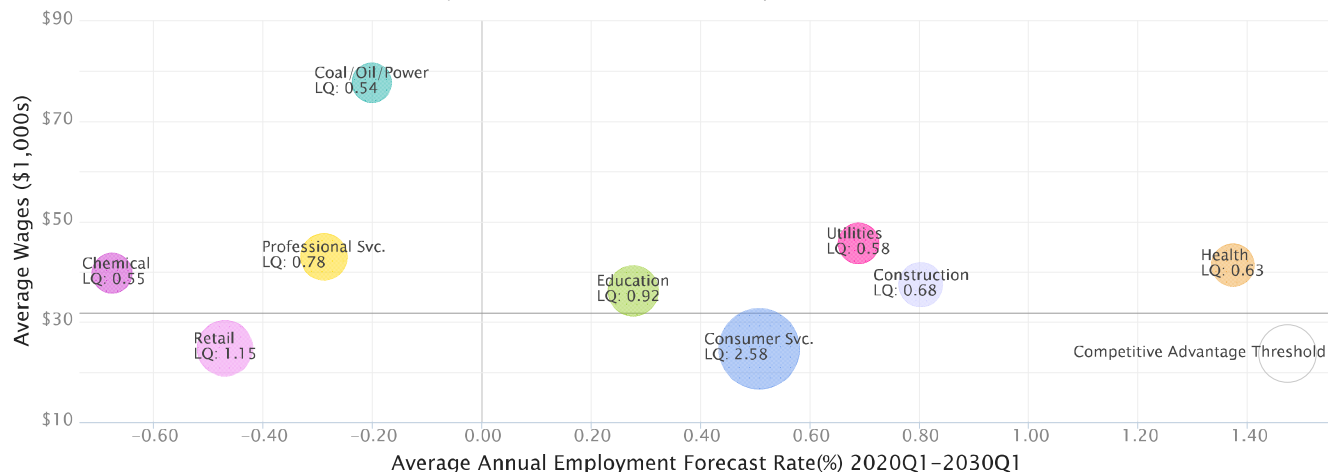

# Industry Clusters

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in the Branson, MO μSA with the highest relative concentration is Consumer Svc. with a location quotient of 2.58. This cluster employs 12,638 workers in the region with an average wage of \$24,629. Employment in the Consumer Svc. cluster is projected to expand in the region about 0.5% per year over the next ten years.

Industry Clusters for Branson, MO μSA as of 2020Q1



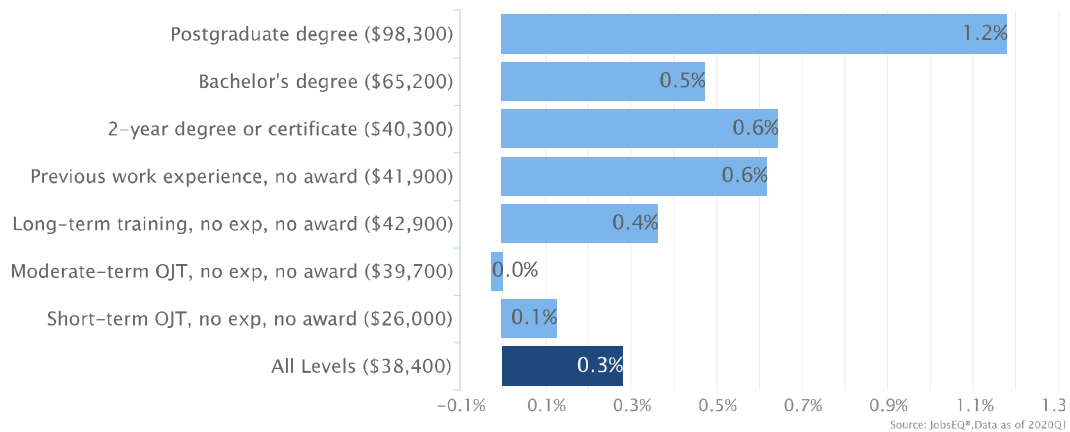

# Education Levels

Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in the Branson, MO μSA is projected to grow 0.3% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 1.2% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to grow 0.5% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to grow 0.6% per year.

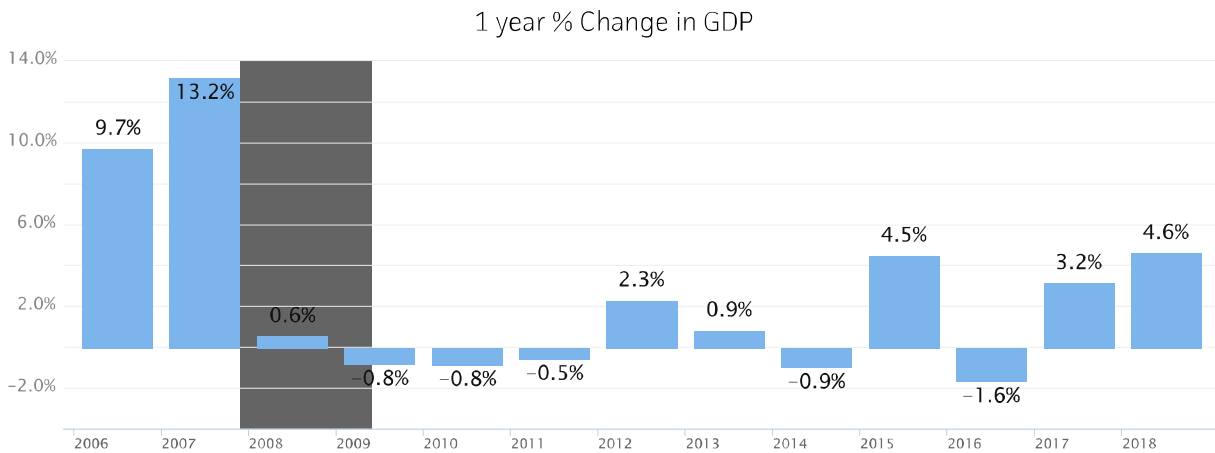
Annual Average Projected Job Growth by Training Required for Branson, MO μSA

# Gross Domestic Product

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is the total value of goods and services produced by a region. In 2018, nominal GDP in the Branson, MO μSA expanded 4.6%. This follows growth of 3.2% in 2017. As of 2018, total GDP in the Branson, MO μSA was \$2,381,302,000.



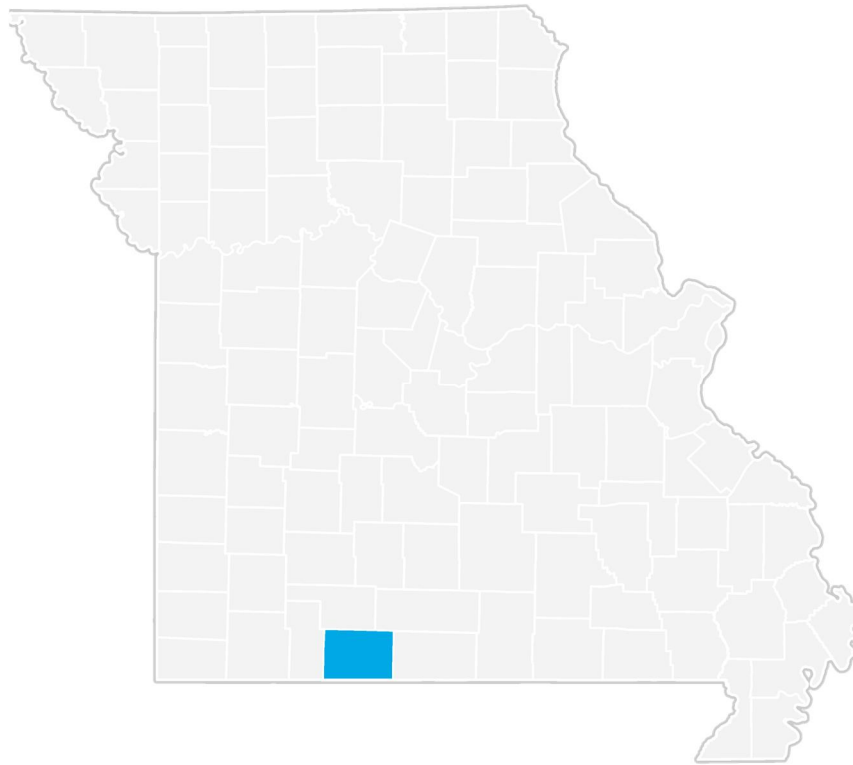

Of the sectors in the Branson, MO μSA, Real Estate and Rental and Leasing contributed the largest portion of GDP in 2018, \$533,583,000. The next-largest contributions came from Accommodation and Food Services (\$443,988,000); Retail Trade (\$222,569,000); and Health Care and Social Assistance (\$170,538,000).

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# FAQ

## What is a location quotient?

A location quotient (LQ) is a measurement of concentration in comparison to the nation. An LQ of 1.00 indicates a region has the same concentration of an industry (or occupation) as the nation. An LQ of 2.00 would mean the region has twice the expected employment compared to the nation and an LQ of 0.50 would mean the region has half the expected employment in comparison to the nation.

## What is separation demand?

Separation demand is the number of jobs required due to separations—labor force exits (including retirements) and turnover resulting from workers moving from one occupation into another. Note that separation demand does not include all turnover—it does not include when workers stay in the same occupation but switch employers. The total projected demand for an occupation is the sum of the separation demand and the growth demand (which is the increase or decrease of jobs in an occupation expected due to expansion or contraction of the overall number of jobs in that occupation).

## What is a cluster?

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. If a regional cluster has a location quotient of 1.25 or greater, the region is considered to possess a competitive advantage in that cluster.

## What is the difference between industry wages and occupation wages?

Industry wages and occupation wages are estimated via separate data sets, often the time periods being reported do not align, and wages are defined slightly differently in the two systems (for example, certain bonuses are included in the industry wages but not the occupation wages). It is therefore common that estimates of the average industry wages and average occupation wages in a region do not match exactly.

## What is NAICS?

The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) is used to classify business establishments according to the type of economic activity. The NAICS Code comprises six levels, from the “all industry” level to the 6-digit level. The first two digits define the top level category, known as the “sector,” which is the level examined in this report.

## What is SOC?

The Standard Occupational Classification system (SOC) is used to classify workers into occupational categories. All workers are classified into one of over 804 occupations according to their occupational definition. To facilitate classification, occupations are combined to form 22 major groups, 95 minor groups, and 452 occupation groups. Each occupation group includes detailed occupations requiring similar job duties, skills, education, or experience.

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
