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Demographic Profile

The population in the City of Branson, MO was 11,416 per American Community Survey data for 2015-2019.

The region has a civilian labor force of 5,724 with a participation rate of 61.3%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in the City of Branson, MO, 23.8% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 33.5% in the nation.

The median household income in the City of Branson, MO is \$46,319 and the median house value is \$157,500.



Employment Trends

As of 2020Q4, total employment for the City of Branson, MO was 16,457 (based on a four-quarter moving average). Over the year ending 2020Q4, employment declined 8.3% in the region.



Wage Trends

The average worker in the City of Branson, MO earned annual wages of \$33,933 as of 2020Q4. Average annual wages per worker increased 5.9% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$60,761 in the nation as of 2020Q4.

Cost of Living Index

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 10.3% lower in City of Branson, MO than the U.S. average.



Industry Snapshot

The largest sector in the City of Branson, MO is Accommodation and Food Services, employing 5,308 workers. The next-largest sectors in the region are Retail Trade (3,136 workers) and Health Care and Social Assistance (1,780). High location quotients (LQs) indicate sectors in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The sectors with the largest LQs in the region are Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation (LQ = 5.89), Accommodation and Food Services (4.23), and Real Estate and Rental and Leasing (2.34).

Sectors in the City of Branson, MO with the highest average wages per worker are Management of Companies and Enterprises (\$78,777), Finance and Insurance (\$64,601), and Utilities (\$56,701). Regional sectors with the best job growth (or most moderate job losses) over the last 10 years are Health Care and Social Assistance (+245 jobs), Educational Services (+163), and Real Estate and Rental and Leasing (+126).

Over the next 10 years, employment in the City of Branson, MO is projected to contract by 508 jobs. The fastest growing sector in the region is expected to be Health Care and Social Assistance with a +0.5% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Health Care and Social Assistance (+99 jobs), Transportation and Warehousing (+3), and Other Services (except Public Administration) (+2).

Occupation Snapshot

The largest major occupation group in the City of Branson, MO is Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations, employing 3,586 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Sales and Related Occupations (2,747 workers) and Office and Administrative Support Occupations (1,926). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (LQ = 2.91), Building and Grounds Cleaning and Maintenance Occupations (2.56), and Sales and Related Occupations (1.73).

Occupation groups in the City of Branson, MO with the highest average wages per worker are Legal Occupations (\$87,600), Architecture and Engineering Occupations (\$82,900), and Management Occupations (\$80,400). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 2.6% among Community and Social Service Occupations to 19.2% among Personal Care and Service Occupations.

Over the next 10 years, the fastest growing occupation group in the City of Branson, MO is expected to be Community and Social Service Occupations with a +1.4% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (+95 jobs) and Healthcare Support Occupations (+43). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (6,252 jobs) and Sales and Related Occupations (3,855).



Industry Clusters

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in the City of Branson, MO with the highest relative concentration is Consumer Svc. with a location quotient of 3.24. This cluster employs 7,423 workers in the region with an average wage of \$25,020. Employment in the Consumer Svc. cluster is projected to contract in the region about 0.1% per year over the next ten years.





Education Levels

Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in the City of Branson, MO is projected to contract 0.3% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 0.6% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to contract 0.2% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to grow 0.0% per year.



FAQ

What is a location quotient?

A location quotient (LQ) is a measurement of concentration in comparison to the nation. An LQ of 1.00 indicates a region has the same concentration of an industry (or occupation) as the nation. An LQ of 2.00 would mean the region has twice the expected employment compared to the nation and an LQ of 0.50 would mean the region has half the expected employment in comparison to the nation.

What is separation demand?

Separation demand is the number of jobs required due to separations—labor force exits (including retirements) and turnover resulting from workers moving from one occupation into another. Note that separation demand does not include all turnover—it does not include when workers stay in the same occupation but switch employers. The total projected demand for an occupation is the sum of the separation demand and the growth demand (which is the increase or decrease of jobs in an occupation expected due to expansion or contraction of the overall number of jobs in that occupation).

What is a cluster?

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. If a regional cluster has a location quotient of 1.25 or greater, the region is considered to possess a competitive advantage in that cluster.

What is the difference between industry wages and occupation wages?

Industry wages and occupation wages are estimated via separate data sets, often the time periods being reported do not align, and wages are defined slightly differently in the two systems (for example, certain bonuses are included in the industry wages but not the occupation wages). It is therefore common that estimates of the average industry wages and average occupation wages in a region do not match exactly.

What is NAICS?

The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) is used to classify business establishments according to the type of economic activity. The NAICS Code comprises six levels, from the "all industry" level to the 6-digit level. The first two digits define the top level category, known as the "sector," which is the level examined in this report.

What is SOC?

The Standard Occupational Classification system (SOC) is used to classify workers into occupational categories. All workers are classified into one of over 804 occupations according to their occupational definition. To facilitate classification, occupations are combined to form 22 major groups, 95 minor groups, and 452 occupation groups. Each occupation group includes detailed occupations requiring similar job duties, skills, education, or experience.
