# **Demographic Profile**

The population in Stone County, Missouri was 31,615 per American Community Survey data for 2015-2019.

The region has a civilian labor force of 13,205 with a participation rate of 48.7%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in Stone County, Missouri, 16.1% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 33.5% in the nation.

The median household income in Stone County, Missouri is \$49,656 and the median house value is \$172,600.



# **Employment Trends**


As of 2021Q2, total employment for Stone County, Missouri was 7,828 (based on a four-quarter moving average). Over the year ending 2021Q2, employment increased 12.3% in the region.



Employment data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2021Q1 with preliminary estimates updated to 2021Q2.

## **Unemployment Rate**

The unemployment rate for Stone County, Missouri was 3.8% as of October 2021. The regional unemployment rate was lower than the national rate of 4.3%. One year earlier, in October 2020, the unemployment rate in Stone County, Missouri was 4.8%.



# Wage Trends

The average worker in Stone County, Missouri earned annual wages of \$32,195 as of 2021Q2. Average annual wages per worker increased 2.7% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$64,141 in the nation as of 2021Q2.

# **Cost of Living Index**

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 6.4% lower in Stone County, Missouri than the U.S. average.



## **Industry Snapshot**

The largest sector in Stone County, Missouri is Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation, employing 1,364 workers. The next-largest sectors in the region are Retail Trade (1,031 workers) and Construction (966). High location quotients (LQs) indicate sectors in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The sectors with the largest LQs in the region are Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation (LQ = 10.92), Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing and Hunting (2.34), and Construction (2.08).





Employment data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2021Q1 with preliminary estimates updated to 2021Q2.

Sectors in Stone County, Missouri with the highest average wages per worker are Utilities (\$65,860), Information (\$56,236), and Transportation and Warehousing (\$53,843). Regional sectors with the best job growth (or most moderate job losses) over the last 10 years are Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation (+1,177 jobs), Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation Services (+337), and Retail Trade (+110).

Over the next 10 years, employment in Stone County, Missouri is projected to expand by 254 jobs. The fastest growing sector in the region is expected to be Health Care and Social Assistance with a +1.3% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation (+155 jobs), Health Care and Social Assistance (+54), and Accommodation and Food Services (+44).

### **Occupation Snapshot**

The largest major occupation group in Stone County, Missouri is Sales and Related Occupations, employing 938 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (858 workers) and Office and Administrative Support Occupations (841). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Personal Care and Service Occupations (LQ = 2.79), Building and Grounds Cleaning and Maintenance Occupations (2.43), and Construction and Extraction Occupations (1.92).

Occupation groups in Stone County, Missouri with the highest average wages per worker are Legal Occupations (\$90,500), Architecture and Engineering Occupations (\$82,300), and Computer and Mathematical Occupations (\$75,900). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 1.4% among Community and Social Service Occupations to 14.8% among Personal Care and Service Occupations.

Over the next 10 years, the fastest growing occupation group in Stone County, Missouri is expected to be Healthcare Support Occupations with a +2.1% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (+81 jobs) and Personal Care and Service Occupations (+60). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (1,533 jobs) and Sales and Related Occupations (1,339).



# **Industry Clusters**

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in Stone County, Missouri with the highest relative concentration is Agricultural with a location quotient of 2.22. This cluster employs 256 workers in the region with an average wage of \$12,597. Employment in the Agricultural cluster is projected to contract in the region about 0.9% per year over the next ten years.







### **Education Levels**

Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in Stone County, Missouri is projected to grow 0.3% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 0.5% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to grow 0.3% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to grow 0.4% per year.

### **Gross Domestic Product**


Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is the total value of goods and services produced by a region. In 2020, nominal GDP in Stone County, Missouri expanded 0.9%. This follows growth of 2.5% in 2019. As of 2020, total GDP in Stone County, Missouri was \$612,776,000.

Of the sectors in Stone County, Missouri, Real Estate and Rental and Leasing contributed the largest portion of GDP in 2020, \$79,647,000 The next-largest contributions came from Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation (\$78,188,000); Accommodation and Food Services (\$77,582,000); and Retail Trade (\$61,862,000).

### What is a location quotient?

A location quotient (LQ) is a measurement of concentration in comparison to the nation. An LQ of 1.00 indicates a region has the same concentration of an industry (or occupation) as the nation. An LQ of 2.00 would mean the region has twice the expected employment compared to the nation and an LQ of 0.50 would mean the region has half the expected employment in comparison to the nation.

### What is separation demand?

Separation demand is the number of jobs required due to separations—labor force exits (including retirements) and turnover resulting from workers moving from one occupation into another. Note that separation demand does not include all turnover—it does not include when workers stay in the same occupation but switch employers. The total projected demand for an occupation is the sum of the separation demand and the growth demand (which is the increase or decrease of jobs in an occupation expected due to expansion or contraction of the overall number of jobs in that occupation).

### What is a cluster?

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. If a regional cluster has a location quotient of 1.25 or greater, the region is considered to possess a competitive advantage in that cluster.

### What is the difference between industry wages and occupation wages?

Industry wages and occupation wages are estimated via separate data sets, often the time periods being reported do not align, and wages are defined slightly differently in the two systems (for example, certain bonuses are included in the industry wages but not the occupation wages). It is therefore common that estimates of the average industry wages and average occupation wages in a region do not match exactly.

### What is NAICS?

The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) is used to classify business establishments according to the type of economic activity. The NAICS Code comprises six levels, from the "all industry" level to the 6-digit level. The first two digits define the top level category, known as the "sector," which is the level examined in this report.

### What is SOC?

The Standard Occupational Classification system (SOC) is used to classify workers into occupational categories. All workers are classified into one of over 804 occupations according to their occupational definition. To facilitate classification, occupations are combined to form 22 major groups, 95 minor groups, and 452 occupation groups. Each occupation group includes detailed occupations requiring similar job duties, skills, education, or experience.
