Demographic Profile

The population in the Taneyville village, MO was 273 per American Community Survey data for 2016-2020.

The region has a civilian labor force of 107 with a participation rate of 53.5%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in the Taneyville village, MO, 17.4% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 34.3% in the nation.

The median household income in the Taneyville village, MO is \$43,611 and the median house value is \$82,000.

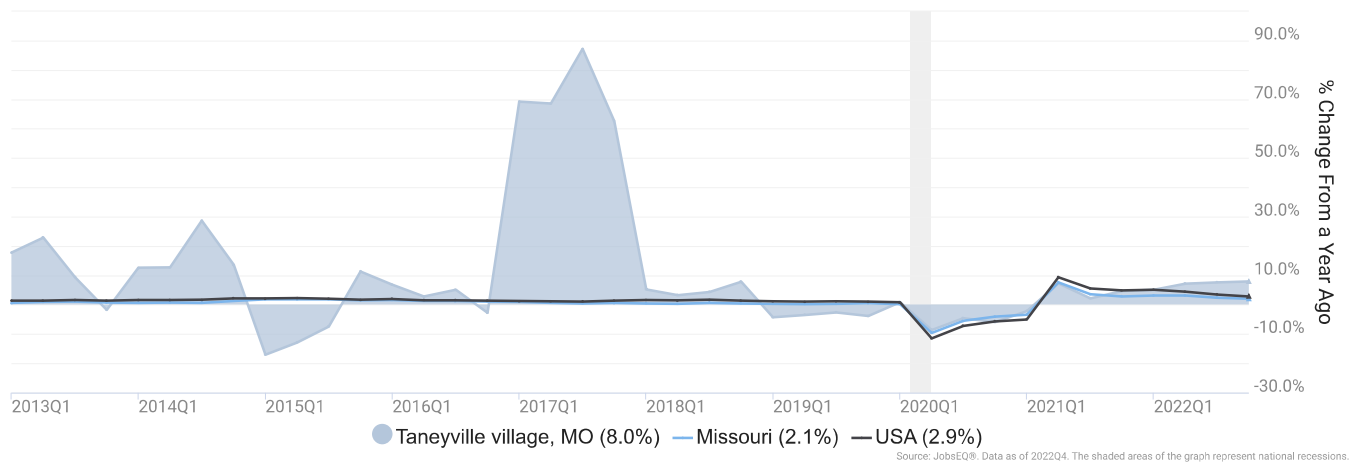

Employment Trends

As of 2022Q4, total employment for the Taneyville village, MO was 103 (based on a four-quarter moving average). Over the year ending 2022Q4, employment increased 8.0% in the region.

Employment for Taneyville village, MO

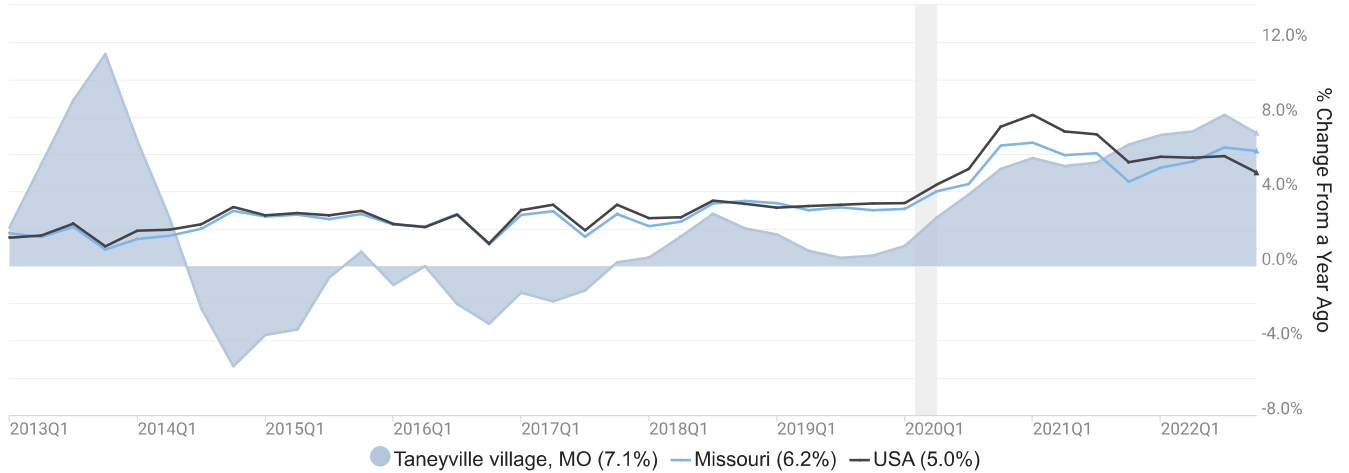

Wage Trends

The average worker in the Taneyville village, MO earned annual wages of \$38,416 as of 2022Q4. Average annual wages per worker increased 7.1% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$68,838 in the nation as of 2022Q4.

Cost of Living Index

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 13.3% lower in Taneyville village, MO than the U.S. average.

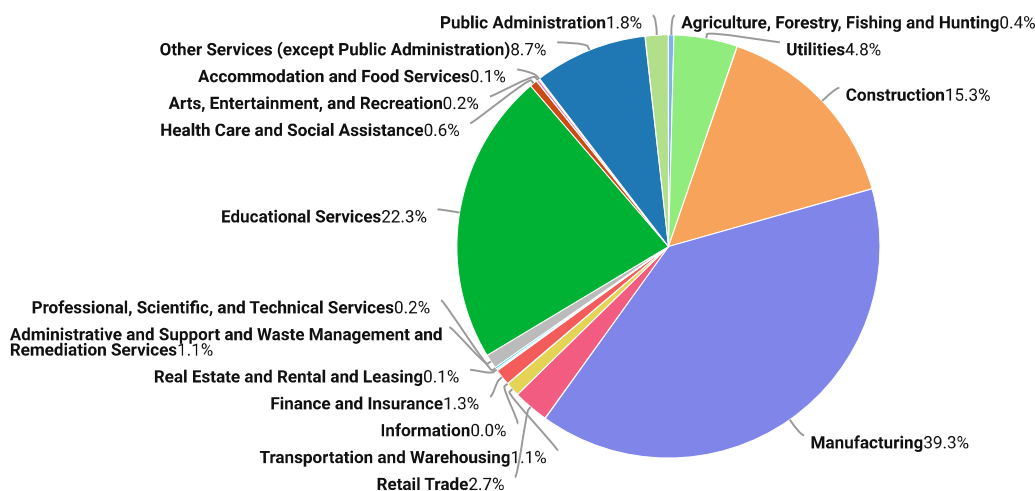

Industry Snapshot

The largest sector in the Taneyville village, MO is Manufacturing, employing 40 workers. The next-largest sectors in the region are Educational Services (23 workers) and Construction (16). High location quotients (LQs) indicate sectors in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The sectors with the largest LQs in the region are Utilities (LQ = 9.61), Manufacturing (4.86), and Educational Services (2.81).

Employment data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2022Q3 with preliminary estimates updated to 2022Q4.

Sectors in the Taneyville village, MO with the highest average wages per worker are Finance and Insurance (\$61,829), Transportation and Warehousing (\$59,347), and Health Care and Social Assistance (\$51,292). Regional sectors with the best job growth (or most moderate job losses) over the last 10 years are Manufacturing (+40 jobs), Construction (+16), and Other Services (except Public Administration) (+7).

Over the next 10 years, employment in the Taneyville village, MO is projected to contract by 7 jobs. The fastest growing sector in the region is expected to be Health Care and Social Assistance with a +1.3% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Educational Services (0 jobs), Other Services (except Public Administration) (0), and Utilities (0).

Data are updated through 2022Q3 with preliminary estimates updated to 2022Q4. Forecast employment growth uses national projections adapted for regional growth patterns.

Occupation Snapshot

The largest major occupation group in the Taneyville village, MO is Production Occupations, employing 23 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Educational Instruction and Library Occupations (16 workers) and Office and Administrative Support Occupations (12). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Production Occupations (LQ = 3.88), Educational Instruction and Library Occupations (2.85), and Construction and Extraction Occupations (2.20).

Occupation groups in the Taneyville village, MO with the highest average wages per worker are Computer and Mathematical Occupations (\$83,900), Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations (\$82,700), and Management Occupations (\$81,800). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from n/a among n/a to n/a among n/a.

Over the next 10 years, the fastest growing occupation group in the Taneyville village, MO is expected to be Healthcare Support Occupations with a +1.6% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Educational Instruction and Library Occupations (0 jobs) and Management Occupations (0). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Production Occupations (24 jobs) and Educational Instruction and Library Occupations (14).

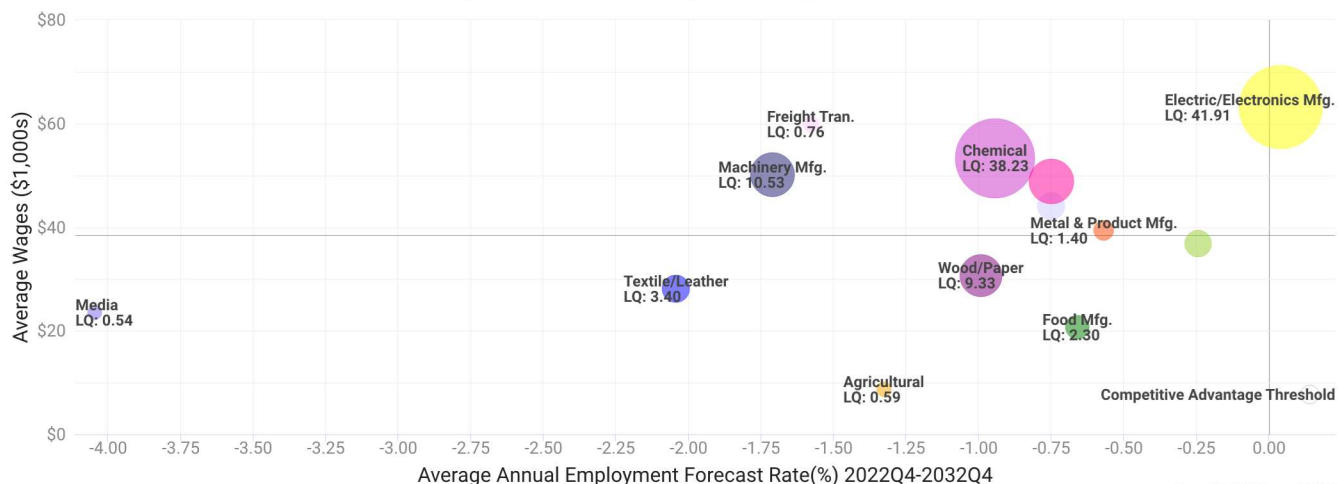

Occupation employment data are estimated via industry employment data and the estimated industry/occupation mix. Industry employment data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and currently updated through 2022Q3, imputed where necessary with preliminary estimates updated to 2022Q4. Wages by occupation are as of 2022 provided by the BLS and imputed where necessary. Forecast employment growth uses national projections from the Bureau of Labor Statistics adapted for regional growth patterns.

Industry Clusters

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in the Taneyville village, MO with the highest relative concentration is Electric/Electronics Mfg. with a location quotient of 41.91. This cluster employs 6 workers in the region with an average wage of \$63,152. Employment in the Electric/Electronics Mfg. cluster is projected to expand in the region about 0.0% per year over the next ten years.

Industry Clusters for Taneyville village, MO as of 2022Q4



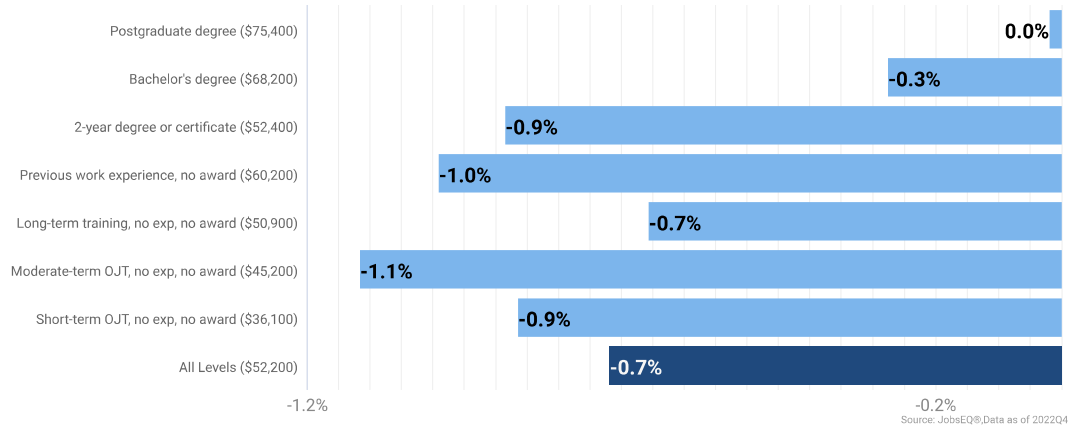

Education Levels

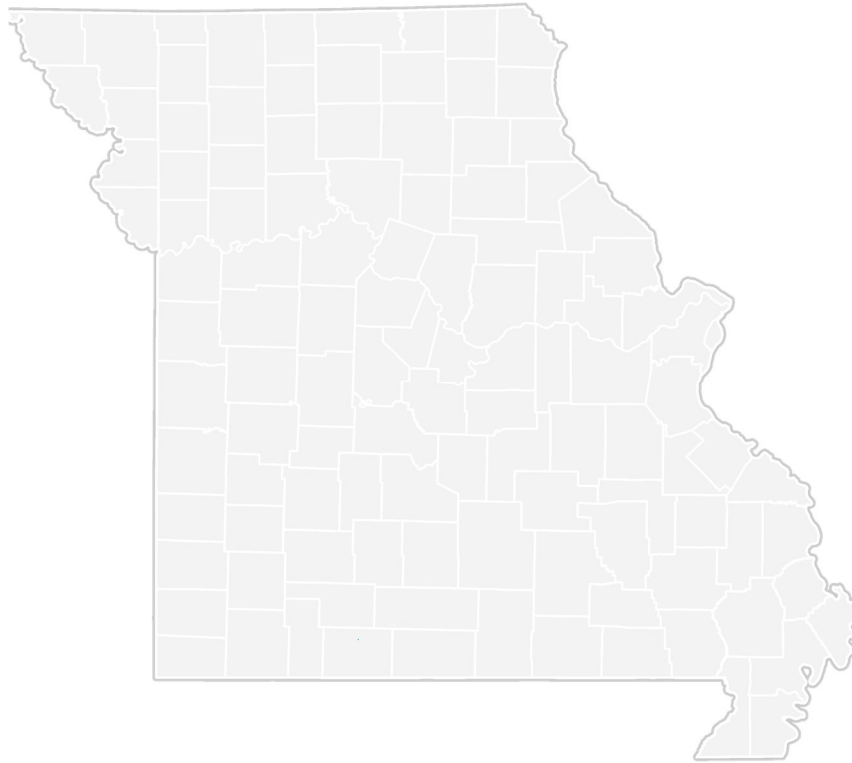
Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in the Taneyville village, MO is projected to contract 0.7% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to contract 0.0% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to contract 0.3% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to contract 0.9% per year.

FAQ

What is a location quotient?

A location quotient (LQ) is a measurement of concentration in comparison to the nation. An LQ of 1.00 indicates a region has the same concentration of an industry (or occupation) as the nation. An LQ of 2.00 would mean the region has twice the expected employment compared to the nation and an LQ of 0.50 would mean the region has half the expected employment in comparison to the nation.

What is separation demand?

Separation demand is the number of jobs required due to separations—labor force exits (including retirements) and turnover resulting from workers moving from one occupation into another. Note that separation demand does not include all turnover—it does not include when workers stay in the same occupation but switch employers. The total projected demand for an occupation is the sum of the separation demand and the growth demand (which is the increase or decrease of jobs in an occupation expected due to expansion or contraction of the overall number of jobs in that occupation).

What is a cluster?

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. If a regional cluster has a location quotient of 1.25 or greater, the region is considered to possess a competitive advantage in that cluster.

What is the difference between industry wages and occupation wages?

Industry wages and occupation wages are estimated via separate data sets, often the time periods being reported do not align, and wages are defined slightly differently in the two systems (for example, certain bonuses are included in the industry wages but not the occupation wages). It is therefore common that estimates of the average industry wages and average occupation wages in a region do not match exactly.

What is NAICS?

The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) is used to classify business establishments according to the type of economic activity. The NAICS Code comprises six levels, from the “all industry” level to the 6-digit level. The first two digits define the top level category, known as the “sector,” which is the level examined in this report.

What is SOC?

The Standard Occupational Classification system (SOC) is used to classify workers into occupational categories. All workers are classified into one of over 804 occupations according to their occupational definition. To facilitate classification, occupations are combined to form 22 major groups, 95 minor groups, and 452 occupation groups. Each occupation group includes detailed occupations requiring similar job duties, skills, education, or experience.
